Census: Area Hispanic population burgeons

The 2010 census numbers show a rapidly growing Hispanic population in certain Central Minnesota communities.

The change also is reflected on the national level. More than half of the total population growth in the U.S. in the past 10 years was because of the increase in the Hispanic population, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

That ethnicity grew 43 percent, from 35.3 million to 50.5 million. They are 16 percent of the total U.S. population of 308.7 million.
